Oct. 20 is the new date for Walk-A-Thon (changed from Oct. 6th) and will also be a full day of school.



The date of our 26th Annual Walk/Run-A-Thon has been changed to Friday, October 20. During the Kick-off Assembly on Sept. 28, students are to receive their Walk/Run-A-Thon envelopes for collecting pledges and donations.

All students who turn in a \$15 donation by Tues., Oct. 3, will enjoy ice cream sundaes scooped by Mr. Martin & Pastor West during their lunch time the next day. We hope that this initial promotion will jump-start us towards our goal of \$12,000. All funds are designated for technology upgrades in the 2017-2018 school year. If we meet our school-wide goal, all the students will enjoy a school-wide "Cookout & Games" Day.

The PreK3, VPK, and Kindergarten students will walk/run laps in the gym. The 1st-12th graders will walk/run laps around the athletic field. Many parents are needed to help count laps. Please plan to come and help - or just cheer your kids on & watch the fun. (See schedule on page 1.)

Every student collecting at least \$50 in flat donations & pledges will receive our annual Walk-A-Thon T-shirt. With at least \$75 collected, they will also qualify for a CiCi's Pizza Party. With \$100 collected, they will (in addition) enjoy Bowling & Lunch with Mr. Martin & Pastor West. Also, there will be two Grand Prizes - a fresh, new \$100 bill for the student who collects the largest amount in PreK-5th - and another \$100 for the student who collects the most in 6th-12th.

There is also a classroom incentive. The classes (one PreK-5th & one Secondary) with the highest percentage of money collected by November 3 (and with at least \$30 collected by 50% of the students in the class) will win "PICNIC & GAMES AT THE PARK"! And ... there will be a prize for the teacher of the very top class - a \$25 Scrip gift card & a day off, with Mr. Martin or Pastor West teaching the class!

The following Tuesdays & Thursdays will be our "Collection Days": Oct. 3, Oct. 5, Oct. 10, Oct. 12, & Oct. 17. By turning in any amount of money on those designated Tuesday & Thursday Collection Days, your student will receive a treat. (Money may be turned in other days but without the treat incentive.) Remember that on the Tues., Oct. 3, collection date - every student who turns in a \$15 flat donation will receive a special treat - a rootbeer or coke float scooped by Mr. Martin & Pastor West at lunchtime the next day. Always send the money in your student's Walk envelope. (The envelopes will be returned to the students after the money is removed and recorded so that they can continue collecting.) In order to qualify for shirts and all other awards, please remember that the money must be turned in by November 3.

In the Walk-A-Thon envelopes, there are form letters for out-of-town friends and family for you to ask them to partner with us and support your child. Using the addressed mailing labels that you supply, we will send out those letters in a bulk mailing on Oct. 11. For every 5 mailing labels/letters your student turns in by Oct. 10, he/she will receive a certificate for a Dress Pass (maximum of 2). Specific dates will be set for the use of those dress passes.

On the day of the event, our 12th graders will sell snow-cones (\$1). Remember that the Walk date has been changed to Fri., Oct. 20, which will be a full day of school.

Parents, we again thank you for your prayers and your continued support of Kingdom education.

Scrip News

Are you still asking, "What is Scrip"?

Traditional fundraisers like bake sales or auctions can provide a significant, one-time boost to our school. They can be effective, but they also take a lot of time and effort. Product fundraisers are popular, too - but you can only ask families to sell cookie dough or wrapping paper so many times per year.

Scrip fundraising is different.

A Scrip program gives parents, grandparents, students, and family members the power to fundraise all the time, without doing anything more than using Scrip **gift cards** to pay for their everyday shopping. They don't have to spend money on things they don't need, make room to organize events in their busy schedules, or sell to friends & relatives.

When families in our school place orders for Scrip, they pay full face value for the gift cards. So if someone orders a \$100 gift card for *Home Depot*, they're paying the school \$100 and getting the full value of what they paid. Now when our school places an order with Great Lakes Scrip, we pay less than the full face value for cards (2% to 13% less, depending on the retailer). The *Home Depot*, for example, offers a 4% rebate, so the school pays \$96 for that \$100 gift card. What happens to that \$4 difference? It's awarded to our school as a rebate!

Each month I like to reward the students whose families participate in Scrip. For each week in October that a family purchases any amount of Scrip, the student will receive an Airhead of their choice.

Thank you to all the families who support the Scrip program. It is not too late for everyone else to jump onboard!
